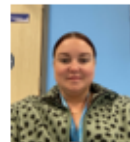


Within each newsletter we will be introducing you to some members of the team. This term we have: -



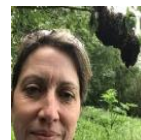
Marieta Van Greunen –
